

LABOUR, EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING

ANNUAL PLAN - 2010 - 2011

INTRODUCTION

Government of Jharkhand through Department of Labour, Employment and Training is committed to provide enhanced Social Security to its old age helpless persons, to protect the interests of its working class in the organised and unorganised sectors in the fast changing economic scenario, to effectively implement various labour laws, to produce trained man power and to provide employment assistance to different skilled persons.

In order to achieve these broad objectives the State Government of Jharkhand is committed to participate in all major central initiatives like Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme, Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojna, Upgradation of ITIs, converting ITIs into Centre of Excellence, etc. While the Department is continuing with the most of schemes initiated earlier we are undertaking to start a number of new schemes.

Skills and knowledge are the driving forces of economic growth and social development. State with higher and better levels of skills adjust more effectively to the challenges and opportunities of world of work. Major challenge of skill development initiatives is also to address the needs of huge population by providing skills in order to make them employable and help them secure gainful employment. Skill development for persons working in the unorganized sector is a key strategy in that direction. This will also inculcate dignity of labour and create greater awareness towards environmental safety and health concerns.

In accordance with the vision statement and objectives of National Policy on Skill Development, the thrust areas of the department will be to create skill development opportunities for all, particularly the disadvantaged groups. The department would also endeavour to promote commitment by all stakeholders to skill development initiatives. In this context initiatives have already been taken to rope in private corporate houses under PPP mode.

Apart from schemes relating to social security and modernization of administrative machinery the Department is committed to set up at least one I.T.I.(General) in all districts and sub divisions and at least one I.T.I. (Women) in every district so that once they become functional we can train upto 10000 youths through them.

2. EARMARKED SCHEMES

2.1 Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme

National Old Age Pension Scheme sponsored by Government of India under National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP), persons of 65 years and above in rural and urban area are getting pension at the rate of Rs. 400/- per month from 1st August 2006 out of which Rs. 200/- is paid by Central Government and Rs.200/- by State Government.

From 19.11.07 National Old Age Pension Scheme has been converted into Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme, under which males/females of the age of 65 years and above of BPL families of rural and urban areas are paid pension at the rate of Rs. 400/- per months.

The number of pensioners in Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Schemes are as below:-

2.2 Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme

Under this scheme all widows in the age group of 40 to 64 years who were included in the list of BPL in the year 2002 will be provided pension by GOI at the rate of Rs. 200/- month. An additional Rs. 200/-per month assistance will be provided by the State Government. This scheme has already been launched in the state in year 2009-10 for which budgetary provision has been made available.

Under this scheme 44681 number of pensioners have been identified/targeted in Tribal Sub Plan, 27703 in Other Sub Plan and 16979 in Special Component Plan for Scheduled Caste. In this way the total number of identified/targeted pensioners is 89363.

2.3 Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme

All disabled persons in the age group of 18-64 years residing in Urban/Rural areas. Included in the BPL list of 2002 who are defined as "Persons with Disabilities Act 1995" (PWD Act, 1995) & National Trust for the welfare of Persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities Act, 1990 (National Trust Act 1990) will be provided monthly pension to the tune of Rs.200/- per month by GOI. An additional assistance of Rs. 200/- will be provided by the State Government. This scheme has also been launched in the state in year 2009-10 and budgetary provision for the same has been made available.

Under this scheme 7500 number of pensioners have been identified/targeted in Tribal Sub Plan, 4650 in Other Sub Plan and 2850 in

Special Component Plan for schedule caste. In this way the total number of identified/targeted pensioners is 15000.

2.4 National Family Benefit Scheme

Under National Family Benefit Scheme, the earning member who is head of the family of BPL category, between the age group of 18 and 65 years, on his death, his dependent family is paid Rs. 10,000/- in one stroke. This scheme is 100% funded by Government of India.

Under this scheme GOI has fixed the target of 20000 beneficiaries:

TSP - 10,600

SCP - 3,000

OSP - 6,400

3. STATE SHARE TO CSS

3.1 Rehabilitation of Bonded Labour [50:50]

Under Central Sponsored Scheme Rehabilitation of Bonded Labourers is being done at the rate of Rs. 20,000/- per labourer.

3.2 Aam Admi Bima Yojna

Aam Admi Bima Yojana has been launched in 2008-09 as Central Sponsored Scheme. Under the scheme, the premium of Rs. 200 is paid for each rural landless family to LIC, the share of Central and State being Rs.100 each. On the death of insured person if due to accident, his dependent has to be paid Rs. 75,000/- and in case of loss of both limbs, he is paid Rs.75,000/- and when there is loss of one limb, insured person is paid Rs. 37,500/-. Under the scheme, his two school going children studying in class IX to XII are to get scholarship @ 100/- per month per child. The Central share is provided directly to LIC.

3.3 Rashtriya Swasthaya Beema Yojna (75:25)

Rashtriya Swasthaya Bima Yojna has been introduced in 2008-09 for the purpose of health insurance to members of B.P.L. families. Under this scheme cashless cards are provided by the insurance company through which medical facilities of Rs. 30,000/- annually may be availed in various empanelled hospitals/nursing centers. A total of 2,50,479 smart cards have been issued in the current financial year 2009-10 in which expenditure to the tune of Rs. 149.00 crore has been incurred. Since the inception of this scheme, a total of 3,81,439 smart cards have been issued and Rs. 3.55 crore worth of claims have been settled. It is targeted that till March, 2010 nearly 5 lakhs smart cards will be prepared under the scheme.

In 2010-11 it is aimed to provide Health Insurance coverage of Rs. 30,000/- to the 25 lakhs B.P.L. families in whole of the state of Jharkhand. It is estimated that the Insurance Company will be able to cover 70% of the total BPL families in the state. It is proposed that the sum of Rs. 3000.00 lakhs including 1% administrative cost may be provided for this scheme.

3.4 Upgradation of ITIs into Centre of Excellence [75:25]

Under this CSS, ITI, Ranchi (Gen.) and Dhanbad have already been established as CoE in the sectors " Production and Manufacturing" & "IT" respectively. In 2008-09 ITI, Sahebganj and Ranchi (Welfare) have been established as C.O.E. ITI Garhwa is proposed to be upgraded under this CSS in 2010-11.

4. STATE PLAN SCHEMES

Continuing Schemes

4.1 State Social Security Scheme

In this plan widow, disabled persons, released bonded labourers (No age limit for those categories) and helpless person of 60 years and above whose income is not exceeding Rs. 5000/- for Rural areas and Rs. 5500/- for Urban areas, Rs. 400/- monthly pension is paid to them. In this scheme the total number of pensioners is 69123 under the Other Sub Plan, under Tribal Sub Plan are 96353 and under Special Component Plan for Scheduled Cast are 42766. Thus, the total number of Pensioners covered under this scheme is 208242.

4.2 Survey of Migrant labourers

The government has taken up survey of migrating labourers of state to other states to know their status for providing assistance to them.

4.3 Organisation of Rural Training Camps and Workshops

Under this scheme, training camps are organized at various levels to educate and to sensitize the stake holders such as labourers, public representatives, unions, government servants, NGOs etc with respect to existing labour laws. Besides different existing labour laws new rules have been also introduced by the government. for the welfare of unorganized workers engaged in buildings and other construction workers. National Health Insurance Scheme has been launched as Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojna with the financial assistance of Central Government. The officers of the department should also be provided training to enhance their skills and vision in respect of existing and new labour laws. In view of the

above it is necessary to organize training camps and workshops for fulfillment of the above goal. In the financial year 2009-10 nearly 100 training camps were organized at different level. During the financial year 2010-11 it is proposed to organize 200 rural training camps

4.4 Organization of Jharkhand Child Labour Commission

Despite legal provision to control the crime against children, child abuse is still growing unchecked. Almost in all small hotels, dhabas and tea-shops one can see small children working. In small scale industries they work in the most unhygienic conditions. The society reacts to such inhuman scenes with apathy. In view to check and control this abuse, Child Labour Commission has been constituted in the State whose head quarter is situated at Ranchi. The Commission will suggest their opinion to the State govt. to eradicate this increasing inhuman activities related to child labourers and to devise strategy for their rehabilitation and awareness program. It is proposed to meet the establishment cost and other activities of the Commission during the FY. 2010-11.

4.5 Strengthening machinery for implementation of minimum wages Act and other labour laws

In addition to extension of the offices of Labour Superintendent (General) previously created in the districts of Latehar, Simdega, Jamtara and Saraikela-kharsawan of the State, it is proposed to create two additional offices of Labour Superintendent (General) in the newly created district-Ramgarh and Khunti to implement the provision of labour laws especially Minimum Wages Act more speedily and effectively. It is proposed to meet the establishment cost during the FY. 2010-11.

4.6 Equipping and Strengthening of labour offices

The regional labour offices including headquarter have to be equipped with computers, fax machines, photocopiers and vehicles to increase their infrastructural resources to cope with day to day modernization and e-governance. In addition to the purchase of the above machines and equipments, it is proposed to provide other supply and material articles such as furniture, Almirah and telephone etc. to meet day to day requirements for the smooth functioning of different regional offices including headquarter. In the Financial Year 2008-09 43 new vehicles were purchased under this scheme. In addition, in the current financial year, 2009-10 machines and equipments are being provided to the regional offices and headquarter. It is proposed for meeting the requirements for equipping and strengthening of the remaining offices during the FY. 2010-11.

4.7 Construction of Houses for Beedi Workers

Clusters of beedi workers are found in the districts such as Pakur, Dumka, Godda, Sahebganj, Saraikela-kharsawan, Chaibasa and Deoghar in Santhal Pargana, Kolhan Division and North Chhotanagpur Division of the State. Those beedi workers who are not covered under any Central or State beneficiary scheme but have own land to construct their houses are benefited by the State Government by granting financial assistance of Rs. 40,000/- per houses for their welfare. It is aimed to construct such 1000 houses per year by the State Govt. In the financial year 2008-09 nearly 800 housing units were constructed. In the current financial year 2009-10 1000 housing units will be constructed. It is proposed to construct 1250 such houses for the welfare of Beedi Workers during the FY. 2010-11.

4.8 Constructions of Building of Labour office

In view to accommodate different labour offices situated in different districts construction of joint labour building is in progress since the last financial year 2006-07. Almost in every scheme, construction work has been started with the allotted funds for these buildings. In order to accommodate offices for the different labour offices situated in Ranchi district a joint labour building at Doranda, Ranchi has been completed last year. In the financial year 2008-09 funds for the construction of 9 (nine) Joint Labour Buildings has been sanctioned on the basis of model estimates. In view of cost escalation & consequent revised estimates of the above joint labour buildings, it is proposed to keep provision for meeting the additional expenditure including furnishing of newly constructed buildings. Further, for construction of 6 new Joint Labour Buildings at Saraikela-Kharsawan, Koderma, Bokaro, Bokaro Thermal, Khunti and Ramgarh and for constructing official quarters at Dhanbad and Jamshedpur as well.

4.9 Establishment of the State Labour Institute at Ranchi

It is proposed to establish a State Labour Institute for imparting training and enhancing the skill and vision of different labour officers, such as Factory Inspector/Boiler Inspector and Labour Enforcement officers etc. In view to establish a State Labour Institute a new building has been constructed during the financial year 2008-09. It is proposed to furnish and equip the building during the FY. 2010-11.

4.10 Establishment and Equipping of Hospital for Beedi Worker

Under this scheme it is proposed to establish and equip the newly constructed buildings for hospital/Health care units situated in the

district of Pakur, West Singhbhum and Dumka. It is proposed to meet the medical and other equipments cost for the above hospitals.

4.11 Extension of newly created Gazetted posts under Labour Commissioner

Under this scheme it is proposed to set up offices of Director (Minimum Wages), Chief Inspecting Officer, Additional Registrar (Trade union), Assistant Labour Commissioner (under CIO), Deputy Labour Commissioner (Monitoring cell), Canteen Manager (equivalent to L.S) and Secretary to Labour Commissioner (equivalent to L.S) for better enforcement of different labour laws such as Minimum Wages Act, Migrant Labour Act, Trade Union Act, Shops & Establishment Act, and to establish government canteens in secretariat buildings and legislative Assembly of the State. In financial year 2010-11 It is also proposed to establish the above offices and to meet the establishment costs of the above said offices. It is also proposed to establish one office of Assistant Labour Commissioner in the office of Resident Commissioner, New Delhi for the welfare of migrant labours who migrate from Jharkhand to other states in view to get their livelihood. It is proposed to create one post of ALC, one post of Assistant, one post of Computer operator and one post of IVth grade also. The fund allocation will be in T.S.P. only.

4.12 Extension of Employment Services

(a) Extension of special Employment Exchanges For Physically handicapped in Bokaro Steel city, Ranchi and Jamshedpur

One of the main functions of Employment Services is to provide Employment assistance to the Physically Handicapped persons. Keeping this in mind, under the provisions of the "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunity, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act 1995, three Special Employment Exchanges for Physically Handicapped were established in Bokaro Steel City, Ranchi & Jamshedpur in the financial year 2004-05 under the Central sponsored scheme in which the central & state expenditure were in the ratio of 80:20 respectively. However, as per the instructions received from central government, the scheme is being run by state plan fund from the year 2007 - 08.

(b) Extension of Offices previously established in the Plan

Under T.S.P., the extension of previously established offices such as District Employment Exchange, Saraikela-Kharsawan, Office of the Dy. Director(Employment), Jamshedpur, Special Employment Exchange for Women, Ranchi, Special Employment Exchange for SC & ST, Dumka, P & E Employment Exchange, Ranchi & Semi Unit (H.Q.), Ranchi is proposed. Apart from this, the extension of University Employment Information & Guidance Bureau, Sidhu Kanhu Murmu University, Dumka which is

being created in this financial year is proposed. Under O.S.P extension of District employment exchange Chatra, Koderma and Non Gazetted posts at Deoghar Employment exchange (being created this year) are also proposed during the FY. 2010-11.

(C) Man Power Planning

(I) Strengthening of the Vocational Guidance Cum Study Centers

On the recommendations of the meeting of the 35th All India Working Group, Directorate General, Employment and Training issued instructions to open study circles in every District Employment Exchanges & to concretize vocational guidance centers in each DEE. In the first phase in the financial year 2009-10, Vocational Guidance Cum Study Centre in the 6(six) sub -Regional Employment Exchanges, P&E Employment Exchange & the only existing University Employment Information & Guidance Bureau, Ranchi was proposed. The place for establishment of these centers has already been identified in 06 sub-regional employment exchanges. In these centers, books related to Employment/Career, Competitive Magazines, Employment News & Newspapers in Hindi, English & Local Language (if available) will be kept so that the unemployed youth can take advantage of these. Also, vocational guidance & career counselling for the candidates will be made available in these centers. The Officers/Staff of these centers will make available career counselling to the students studying in the educational institutes/technical institutes/colleges/university falling in their jurisdiction. As & when required, on the spot registration of the unemployed youth will also be done. Officer/Staff working in these Employment Exchanges will be given specialized training after the discussion with Central Institute for Research and training in Employment Service (CIRTES) or Directorate General, Employment and Training (DGET). As & when required, the services of Vocational Guidance Counsellors/Career Counselling Experts may also be taken on the basis of charges/honorarium.

(II) ROJGAR MELA

It is proposed to cover expenditure incurred on hired vehicles (with fuel), to contact employers for Rojgar Mela.

(d) Building Construction

As most of the Exchanges were earlier running in private/old rental buildings, steps have been taken to provide the Employment Exchanges, their own buildings. As a result of which almost all the Employment Exchanges, now have their own buildings with all basic amenities. In the last financial year as against the total technically estimated cost of Rs. 1,60,48,000/- for the construction of quarters for Officer & Staff of Bokaro

Steel City, only Rs. One Crore has been paid so far. Rest amount i.e. Rs. 60,48,000/- will required to be paid in next financial year. A sum of Rs 22,95,000/- will also be required for payment against the increased cost of Deoghar Employment Exchange building. Thus a sum of Rs 83.43 lakh is required.

For boundary wall & approach road to newly constructed building or for payment towards increased cost of building under construction under O.S.P a plan outlay is proposed during the FY. 2010-11.

(e) Maintenance of Computer & Supplies of Computer accessories / Stationery

Computers in almost all the exchanges for accounts, establishment & related works have already been provided by the Department under plan head. A Sum of Rs 4.81 lakh is available in this financial year. Maintenance /repairing, office expenditure is proposed during FY. 2010-11.

4.13 Management Information System

Under this scheme information's pertaining to admission, examination and other information's regarding ITIs are maintained at headquarter level. It is planned to connect ITIs to Directorate through networking. Establishment expenditure, office expenditure and machine and equipment are proposed during the FY. 2010-11.

4.14 Modernization of Training and Administrative Infrastructure

Under this plan all ITIs & other allied establishments (offices) are proposed to be equipped with machines equipments furnitures etc. During F.Y. 2008-09 orders worth Rs. 963.52 lakhs was placed to public sector company H.M.T. Ltd. for supply of heavy machine tools. All the machines ordered are likely to be supplied by the end of January 2010. Computer equipments worth Rs. 28.23 lakhs were procured during the same fiscal.

In the Current Financial Year 2009-10 purchase order for supply of heavy machine tools worth Rs. 868.81 lakhs has been placed to H.M.T. Ltd.

4.15 Extension of Vocational Training

This scheme will cater to the need of establishment cost of working ITIs / Courses under plan head and also for the establishment cost of general ITI (TSP-Ghatshila, Pakur and Gumla / OSP-Jhagratarnh, Ramgarh, Deoghar and Koderma) and New WITIs (OSP-Ramgarh, Garhwa, Daltonganj, Giridih, Deoghar, Godda, Bokaro and Dhanbad / TSP - Gumla, Simdaga, Sahebganj, Pakur, Saraikela-Kharsawan, Lohardaga, Jamtara and Khunti). Establishment expenditure is proposed during the FY. 2010-11.

4.16 Consultancy/ Professional Services

This plan was started in 2008-09. For the forthcoming fiscal 2010-11 for obtaining of specialist and consultancy services for establishment of Instructor Training Centre at Ranchi and any other project as per need.

4.17 Computer Training in ITIs

For imparting computer training to the staff and trainees of various existing running ITIs of the state this scheme was started from 2009-10 to make the staff & trainees of ITIs conversant about basic computer applications.

4.18 Strengthening of Craftsman / Apprenticeship training Schemes

Under this scheme gazetted / non-gazetted posts are proposed to be created at directorate level at state's second capital Dumka, Ranchi and Adityapur and also for the proposed instructor training centre Ranchi for shouldering the ever increasing responsibility of the directorate and for training and retraining of the faculty of the ITI and ITCs of the state. The proposal for creation of the posts expect for the instructor training centre have already been sent for approval of Finance Department. After the creation of posts funds are proposed to be allocated through re-appropriation from other plan. Creation of posts for Instructor training centre will be put-up shortly.

4.19 Building Construction of ITIs & Allied offices

Construction activities of all the earlier ongoing schemes have been clubbed under this scheme.

The scheme will take care of (liabilities) of ongoing building projects. Projects currently under progress which have liabilities are building construction of Industrial Training Institute, Ghaghara, Chakulia, Bahragora, Chandwa, Mahuatand, Chatrapur, Hussainabad, Manoharpur, Jagarnathpur, Jamtara, Simdega, Lohardaga, Chandil, Rajmahal, Barhi, Madhupur, Nagaruntari and Women Industrial Training Institute, Latehar and Construction of Hostel of WITI, Dhanbad and Bokaro.

4.20 Plan for acquiring land for ITIs

Under this plan Govt. has decided to procure public land for constructing ITIs Buildings where Govt. land is not available.

4.21 Employee State Insurance Scheme

Under Employee State Insurance Scheme, there are two posts of Regional Administrative Medical Officer and their officers at Jamshedpur and

Dhanbad. Their work is supervision and inspection of E.S.I. dispensaries and hospitals in their Zone.

New Schemes

4.22 Awareness and Rehabilitation of Child Labour

In this scheme it is proposed to undertake awareness and rehabilitation work by the State Govt for the welfare of child labours released from different hazardous and non-hazardous occupations and processes in the context of child labour laws. In this scheme it is proposed to construct one rehabilitation center at Ranchi.

4.23 Strengthening of Employment Services

(i) Creation of non-gazetted posts in Dumka

For creation of non gazetted posts in already functioning office of Dy. Director, Dumka. For creation of these posts approval of **PADWARG SAMITI** has already been obtained.

(ii) Upgradation of District Employment Exchange Daltonganj into Sub Regional Employment Exchange

As Daltonganj (Medninagar) has been upgraded to the status of a Division (Commissionary), hence under O.S.P upgradation of District Employment Exchange, Daltonganj to Sub Regional Employment Exchange is proposed with creation of required gazetted & non-gazetted posts.

(iii) Establishment of PeMT

As the Employment Exchanges in the State are going to be online in the financial year 2009-10, a PeMT (Project e-governance Mission Team) has been created in the Inter Departmental meeting with the officials of IT Department. The task of the team will be to manage & maintain the online system functioning in the Employment Exchanges. All complains in the functioning of the online system will be registered & rectified by PeMT. For the purchase of a vehicle (along with fuel & maintenance) & maintenance of the online system, including the hardware functioning in the Employment Exchanges.

(iv) Construction of building for Coaching Cum & Guidance Centre for SC / ST Ranchi

Coaching cum Guidance centre for SC / ST Ranchi is running in a rented house in the Rajendra Bhawan Building Sanik market complex, Main Road, Ranchi. As per laid down principles of Central Govt. the expenditure on establishment including machinery, stipend and administrative cost is to be beared by the Central Govt. Whereas the State Govt. has to provide a rent free accommodation. In order to provide a rent

free accommodation it is proposed to construct a building in the premises of Sub-Regional campus Ranchi.

4.24 New Construction of ITIs

Under this scheme new projects of buildings of ITIs and allied offices are to be constructed for FY. 2010-11. New constructions proposed are Industrial Training Institute, Latehar and other block level ITIs(TSP and OSP) and Boundary walls of all Women Industrial Training Institute, under Construction i.e. OSP- WITI, Ramgarh, Garhwa, Daltonganj, Giridih, Deoghar, Godda, Bokaro, Dhanbad and Under TSP WITI, Gumla, Simdaga, Sahebganj, Pakur, Saraikela-Kharsawan, Lohardaga, Jamtara, Khunti.

4.25 Land Acquisition for E.S.I. Dispensaries

Under E.S.I. Scheme 23 dispensaries and one hospital are functioning. All the 23 dispensaries are operating from rented buildings. The Government of India (E.S.I. Corporation) have launched I.T. roll out plan, Project Panchdeep in all the dispensaries and hospitals of E.S.I. Scheme so that insured persons and their family members get complete & proper treatment and other facilities in an efficient and timely manner; this would require that dispensary buildings should have all the basic facilities and amenities as well as proper and sufficient work space. It is proposed to acquire land for the construction of building of E.S.I. dispensaries. It is also proposed to acquire land for construction of E.S.I. dispensaries under E.S.I. Scheme.

5. TRIBAL SUB PLAN

A sum of **Rs. 32755.73** lakhs has been earmarked for Tribal Sub Plan out of total proposed outlay of **Rs. 65000.00** lakhs during Annual Plan 2010-11.

6. SPECIAL COMPONENT SUB PLAN

A sum of **Rs. 9508.48** lakhs has been earmarked for Special Component Sub Plan out of total proposed outlay of **Rs. 65000.00** lakhs during Annual Plan 2010-11.
