## ANNUAL REPORT - 2010 - 2011

### INTRODUCTION

The newly carved out resource rich State of Jharkhand is widely acclaimed as the region of the future, having immense potential for industrialisation with its large deposits of minerals, which could provide a firm launching pad for various industries. It is one of the richest zones of minerals in the world. As large as the 40% of the total minerals of the country are available in this state. The State is the sole producer of cooking coal, uranium and pyrite. It ranks first in the production of coal, mica, kyanite and copper in India. The geographical exploration and exploitation of gold, silver, base metals, decorative stones, precious stones, etc. are the potential areas of the future.

Jharkhand is also endowed with other resources such as surface and ground water, land with immense bio-diversity, moderate climate, disciplined and skilled manpower, adequate availability of power, which are the basic essentials for the growth and development of industries.

The State Government firmly believes in maximizing capital investment in the State for its accelerated economic development and generation of employment opportunities. The State Government is committed to create an environment, conducive to growth of industries in the State. It is determined to encourage investment in the industries based upon the State's agro-climatic, mineral and manpower resources as also in development of infrastructure.

The Government of Jharkhand, in consonance with the need and aspirations of the local populace and entrepreneurs, the changes taking place in the global and national economic scenario and the competition at the national and international level modifying the current applicable Industrial Policy 2001 for attracting investment including foreign investment in identified thrust areas with a focus upon the Balanced Regional Development as also for creation of essential infrastructure including power generation.

The Government is committed to facilitate rapid, accelerated and planned industrial growth of the region. It shall provide the required infrastructure, simplified mechanisms, sensitive and proactive Government machinery and a friendly atmosphere for industrial growth in the State. It is determined to bring the Industrial Development of Jharkhand at par with leading industrially developed states of the country.

## **OBJECTIVE**

The Industrial Policy aims at making Jharkhand one of the most preferred destination for investment, both from inside and outside the country and to ensure accelerated implementation of infrastructure related projects, increasing employment opportunities, improving productivity, ensuring homogeneous and balanced development of all Geographical regions of the State with emphasis on development of small, tiny and cottage industries.

## **STRATEGY**

The strategies to be adopted for achieving the objectives are broadly as follows

- Simplified rules, regulations and procedures to remove bottlenecks
- Provide adequate good quality infrastructural support.
- Single Window System
- Introduce latest scientific data collection
- Improve the quality of services to entrepreneurs with sharp focus upon SC/ST categories, handicapped and women
- Thrust to entrepreneurship development through Establishment of Entrepreneur Development Institute( EDI) and other specialized institutions
- Identify the area of concentration of traditional skills and provide training, improve design, technological backup and marketing
- Encourage setting up fruit processing, vegetable processing, spice processing, horticulture and other food processing industries
- Develop Industrial Park for specialized activities in the field of knowledge, Information Technology, Tassar/Mulberry, Electronics, Plastic, Chemicals, Biotech and Herb, Export and Food Processing with adequate power, water, communication, transport and other common facilities.
- Emphasis on small power generating units and developing non conventional sources of energy through private participation.
- Special attention to promote projects in Public Private Partnership (PPP) modes.

## **2. STATE SHARE TO CSS**

### **2.1 Tool Room**

Tool Room Ranchi & Dumka is completed. The Tool Room at Ranchi & Dumka had proposed to put up additional training equipment & Housing complex for their staff. Enhanced budgetary support was released during last financial year for equipment. On receipt technical sanction for housing complex the budgetary support shall be made available. The Government will also explore possibility of setting up other Tool Room as per Government of India scheme.

### **2.2 Integrated Handloom Development Scheme**

It is a centrally Sponsored Scheme for handloom weavers. It consists of Handloom Cluster development / Group approach / Marketing support/ Strengthening of Handloom organization/Supervision, Monitoring Inspection support etc. Infrastructure support for skill up gradation support, work shade, establishment support etc. are provided for Handloom weavers & weavers' organization under this scheme.

### **2.3 Diversified Handloom Development Scheme**

It is a centrally sponsored scheme for Handloom Sector. It consists of establishment of weaver service centre/IIHT for fulfilment of technical qualified hands in the State and to benefit of weavers under centrally sponsored scheme.

### **2.4 Small Industries Cluster Development Programme (SICDP)**

It is a centrally sponsored scheme under the control of the Ministry of Small Scale Industries (SSI); GOI. Under this scheme the cluster approach is a key strategy for enhancing the productivity and competitiveness as well as capacity building of small enterprises including small scale industries and small service and business entities.

The contribution of the Ministry of Small Scale Industries (SSI); GOI is upto 80% of the total project cost subject to ceiling of Rs. 10 Cr.

During Annual plan 2010-11 establishment of Small Industries Cluster centers at Chirkunda (Dhanbad), Vishnugarh (Hazaribagh), Jharigarh (Kunti), Vendra (Bokaro) and Mini cement cluster (Ramgarh) have been planned in the State.

## **3. STATE PLAN SCHEME**

## **Continuing Scheme Village & Small Industries**

### **3.1 Handicrafts**

It constitutes important sector in rural industrialization due to its popularity inside & outside the country. State Govt. is keen in emphasizing the development of handicrafts as it helps in upliftment of socio-economic conditions of the rural artisans. Under T.S Plan four centers are running in current year 2009-10 and 320 trainees are being trained in training centers. These are located at Ranchi, Khunti, Jamshedpur & Dumka District. In Manasmariya, Chakulia (East Singhbhum) one chemical treatment plant for bamboo & C.F.C are proposed to be established during the year 2010-11. Thus for running these Training Centers and establishing chemical treatment plant of Bamboo at Manasmariya and upliftment of Handicraft centers in T.S.P area is proposed during the year 2010-11.

Under OS Plan four centers are operating at Dhanbad, Hazaribag, Deoghar & Palamau. 300 Trainees are being trained in different trades. 240 ladies will be trained in the year 2010 at Madhuban, Peer-tand Giridih in Agarvatti Nirman, cutting-stitching & Kantha stitch. Thus total 540 numbers of persons will be trained in coming year. Health Insurance plan and upliftment of Handicraft centre Hazaribag & Dhanbad are proposed for year 2010-11.

### **3.2 Handloom**

Handloom sector plays an important role in providing part time as well as full time gainful employment to weavers in the State. The main objective of Annual Plan is to provide working facilities to weavers and to impart training. Besides, steps are being taken for modernization of looms, updating of technology by running modern design centre, marketing assistance, establishment of Processing House, Textile Park, WSC, Health insurance of weavers, Mahatma Gandhi Weaver's Insurance, Upgradation of Weaver Training Centers, organization of workshop, seminar, fair & exhibition, rebate grant on the sale of Handloom product etc. JHARCRAFT, established for marketing & design development of diversified Handloom products for which share capital & managerial grant in aid has to be provided to JHARCRAFT.

### **3.3 Sericulture Development**

State Government is aiming towards overall development of sericulture and its related industries in the state, so that more and more numbers of beneficiaries could be benefited.

During the year 2010-11, it is proposed to rear 2.35 lakh tasar nucleus Dfls, 16 lakh of tasar basic dfls and 96 lakh of commercial dfls through seed and commercial rearers in the State. It is proposed to be benefited 40,000 -50,000 tasar farmers through tasar seed production and its rearing during the year.

In pre-cocoon sector, 8000-10,000 tasar farmers will be given training on improved technology of silkworm rearing for qualitative and quantitative improvement in production. 45 matriculate youths will be given one year certificate course training at Jharkhand Silk Technical Development Institute, Chaibasa for self employment generation. Similarly, for higher studies, 20 unemployed Graduate youths with Bio science stream are proposed to be given 15 months Post Graduate Diploma in Sericulture Course at Central Tasar Research and Training Institute, Central Silk Board, Govt. of India, Nagri, Ranchi.

For development in post cocoon sector, 1,400 weavers are proposed to be given training on value addition and improved technology of weaving at Shaheed Nirmal Mahato Jharkhand Resham Prashikchhan Sansthan, Bhagaiya, and Godda. For self employment 720 women beneficiaries will be given training on improved technology for tasar reeling.

It is proposed to construct 20-30 new grainage houses for increase in tasar seed (Dfl) production in the State, so as to increase the seed cocoon preservation capacity up to 20-30 lacks vis-à-vis to enhance 4-6 lakh tasar seed (Dfl) production. Grainage houses are proposed to be constructed at Pilot Project Centre Hatgamaria, Debrasai, Chakradharpur, Goilkeria, Kuchai, Kharsawan, Bharbharia, Ghatshila in Kolhan area, Jharkhand Sericulture Development Institute in Ranchi, Govindpur, Bengabad, Dumri in Giridih and Godda, Amrapara and Littipara in Santhal Pargana area.

In the Post cocoon sector, Cocoon bank of 50 lakh storage capacity is proposed to be established at Govindpur, Tundi, Dumri, Ghatshila, Chiyanki, Nagaruntari and Borio for strengthening post cocoon activities.

To create infrastructural facilities in sericultural area/centers extension-cum-administrative building is proposed to be built at Borio, Govindpur, Debrasai and Bharbharia besides construction of staff quarters in remote area/centers.

20,000-30,000 promising and active farmers, who are engaged in sericulture activities, are proposed to be surveyed in sericulture areas. For development of Mulberry silks 20 groups (consisting of 11 farmers in each group) are to be benefited in the State. In this sector, raising of 100 acres of mulberry plantation, undertake mulberry rearing and imparting training is proposed to be given to these groups. Extension of organic Silk Certification for tasar cocoons and its production is proposed to cover new areas in the State. In this context, about 10,000 cocoon producers are proposed to be surveyed and will be covered under the purview of organic Silk Certification category.

### **3.4 Khadi Gramodyog Board**

To promote Khadi and Village Industries, the State Government has established State Khadi & Gramodyog Board to promote Khadi.

### **3.5 Design Development and Training Centre**

Under Special Component scheme Bamboo training cum production centers are being established at Paras Nath Giridih. Basic training for 100 trainees are being imparted.

In Mansumariya, Chakulia (East Singhbhum) 40 Trainees are being Trained in bamboo craft. Thus a total of 140 S.C trainees are being trained.

Thus for Special Component Programme a total Rs. 200.00 Lakh only will be required for establishing C.F.C, T.C.P and training programme.

Under TSP Design Development Scheme 2374 women are being trained in Applique kantha stitch, Tie & Dye, Jute Craft, Kasidakari, Terra Kotta, Paper mashi & Jado Patiya. 40 Trainees are also being trained in cutting & Polishing of Gems & Diamond.

950 Students of Kasturba Gandhi School are being trained in Appliqué, Kantha stitch, Tie & Dya, Jute, Lac, Stitching & cutting, Paper mashie, Painting, Artificial Jewellery & Soft Toys. In Ranchi and lohardaga 14 groups with 240 ladies are being trained in Jardlji.

Thus a total number of 3854 trainees and students are being trained. A sum of Rs. 250.00 Lakh will be required during financial year 2010-11.

Under OSP Design Development Scheme 1710 ladies are being trained in kantha stitch, kasidakari paper mashie, carry bag, Packaging Boxes and another 20 trainees are also being trained in Dhokra.

Thus a total no. of 1730 trainees are being trained in different craft. For meeting these expenditure of TCP, running CFC etc.

### **3.6 Urban Haat**

Under the joint enterprise of Handicraft and Handloom Department Under Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India and Department of Industries, Govt. of Jharkhand, the project of Urban Haat is being set up to organize and promote handicraft items made by skilled artisans of the State, so that they may not be exploited by the intermediaries. Urban Haat at Hazaribag, Deoghar, Giridih are being set up.

### **Industries (Other than VSI)**

#### **3.7 Industrial Area Development Authority**

It is a continuing scheme. There are four Industrial Area Development Authorities in Jharkhand State located at Ranchi, Bokaro, Dumka and Adityapur. These authorities are assigned the job of development in selected areas by

providing developed plots, sheds and infrastructure facilities for setting up industrial units.

These authorities are responsible for locating the potential areas for development of large, medium and small industries. Besides identification of resources and demand based industries special emphasis is laid on identification of ancillary and auxiliary and SSI Units. These authorities also help the units in obtaining financial assistance as a term loan or working capital from financial Institutions or commercial banks.

- Renovation & creation of Infrastructure Development (Devipur, BIADA)
- Land acquisition & its Developments (AIADA)
- Construction of Administrative Building & Infrastructure Development of SPIADA.

### **3.8 Industrial Campaign**

Industrial campaign scheme is to attract capital Investment proposals from outside the State and abroad too. In addition, Buyers-Sellers meet etc. are proposed to be organized to promote marketing of industrial products. In addition, the scheme envisage collection of information regarding infrastructural facilities, new technology etc. by organizing seminars workshop, advertisement for investment opportunities in the State through documentary film, publishing informative books etc.

### **3.9 Single Window System**

The objective of Industrial Assistance Centre (Single Window System) is to provide all types of assistance to entrepreneurs and to remove problem faced by entrepreneurs in course of setting up of industries on the site under one roof so that rapid industrialization may take place.

### **3.10 Training & Study tours**

The staff and officers related with the development of Industries are to be equipped with latest management skills so that the speed of Industrialisation is to be accelerated. In national perspective and vision, orientation of staff & officers is essential towards better working culture with professional, expert and result oriented courses. For achieving such objectives the staff and officers are required to visit different States like Karnataka, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh to impart latest management tools, techniques and develop the skill, the workshops and orientation program need to be organized by the leading management institutions of the country.

### **3.11 India International Trade fair**

India International Trade fair is organized by India Trade Promotion Organisation every year from 14<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> of November. The main objective of the fair is to highlight the State wise country's achievements in various fields like

industry, trade, research and development etc. through display, demonstration and also interaction at different levels.

### 3.12 Jharkhand Udyog Mela

Annual Udyog Mela is also proposed to be organized at Ranchi to show industrial development in the State.

### 3.13 Capital Investment Subsidy

The Capital Investment Incentive shall be admissible to small and medium scale industries of the following categories -

Mega Projects with investment of more than Rs. 50.00 crore is allowed special package as per Mega Investment Incentive Scheme which envisages 3.00 to 15.00 crore incentive for mega project after commercial date of production.

To meet the claim made by the small, medium & large size industrial units, which come into commercial production during the period the Jharkhand Industrial Policy 2001 remains effective.

### 3.14 Captive Power Generating Subsidy

To meet the claim under Captive Power Generating Subsidy under Jharkhand Industrial Policy-2001.

### 3.15 Interest Subsidy

The objective of providing this subsidy is to bring down interest cost of industry for the period an industry is most hard pressed. This subsidy is aimed to encourage industry to continuous growth rather than stagnate and contribute its share of prosperity to the state.

The interest subsidy to new industries shall be admissible in the following manner on the interest actually paid to financial institution/banks on loans by such new industry for following category of industries:

### **3.16 Feasibility Study Cum project reimbursement Subsidy**

Under this scheme project report shall have to be prepared by a recognized consultant approved by the Industries Department .The project report subsidy @ 50% the cost incurred to a maximum of Rs. 50,000/- shall be paid.

### **3.17 Pollution Control Equipment Subsidy**

Under this scheme subsidy of 20% of the cost of the pollution control and monitoring equipment subject to a ceiling of Rs.20 lakh shall be provided to a new and existing industrial units for installation of pollution control and monitoring equipment. To meet the claim under Pollution Control Equipment Subsidy under Jharkhand Industrial Policy-2001.

### **3.18 Outstanding Performance Awards**

On the basis of objective Evaluation Criteria, suitable awards will be given by the State Government for Outstanding achievements in exports, social services, industrial management, pollution control, energy conservation. To meet the claim under Award for Outstanding Performance under Jharkhand Industrial Policy-2001.

### **3.19 Soft Loan for Sick & Closed Industrial units**

Sickness /closure of an industrial unit has an adverse impact on all sectors of production activities Under the scheme the State Government grants "Soft Loan" for revival of industrial units . A concerted effort for revival of sick industries for overall industrial growth of the state is needed, especially in view of chronic problems of sickness in small, medium and large industries in the State which is among the topmost priorities of the State Government. It need not be emphasized that sickness in industries not only affects the revenue of the State but also results in unemployment and non-productive investment. Interest rate of such loans will not be less than bank rate and repayment period will not be more than 8 years.

The State Government in light of Jharkhand Industrial Policy-2001 has notified Jharkhand Industries Rehabilitation Scheme-2003, which envisages soft loan

from the Government for revival of any viable sick, closed and weak units of the State. State Government upon being satisfied in respect of viability of the revival effort may grant by way of extending loans on suitable soft loan/or equity participation that will depend on merits in individual case to bridge the gap in means of finance.

### **3.20 Stamp Duty & Registration Fee Exemption**

An eligible industrial unit irrespective of its location will be entitled to exemption from payment of 50% of Stamp Duty & Registration Fee paid for registration of documents within the State. Relating to purchase /acquisition of land and building for setting up of a new unit to meet the claim under Exemption on Stamp Duty & Registration Fee under Jharkhand Industrial Policy-2001

### **3.21 Growth Centre/ Industrial Park**

Mega Growth Centre at Barhi, Hazaribag has been taken up for providing modern infrastructure facilities for rapid industrialization. This growth centre envisages an investment of Rs.30to 40 crores and shall provide quality infrastructure inputs like land, water, power, communication, etc. This will be developed under PPP mode .JINFRA has been assigned to assist in developing this growth Centre. Industry specific Mini Growth Centers are being contemplated to be set up by the Government at different locations in the State where specific industrial activity needs to be boosted. The location of these growth centers will be selected keeping in mind the inherent locational advantages with respect to availability of raw material, manpower, connectivity and market.

These Growth centers would shift the focus of growth of industries into rural areas, yet ensuring that these growth centers are located near main highway and the district head quarters. This would help in generating employment for the local population, and the nearest town would provide residential/schooling facilities for the families.

To give boost to village based industries, the Government intends to set up Micro Industrial Areas/Parks at each block level which shall provide basic infrastructure facilities to the rural entrepreneurs, artisans and craftsmen. This will give a fillip to employment and rural growth.

### **3.22 Export Oriented Knowledge Parks**

The State Govt. has formulated an ambitious plan to set up Export Oriented Knowledge Parks at Khunti for fast industrial growth of the state. For this purpose land acquisition and infrastructure development.

### **3.23 ASIDE Scheme**

The Govt. of India has the scheme for extending Assistance to States for Development of Export Infrastructure and Allied Activities (ASIDE). The objective of the scheme is to involve the States in the export effort by providing assistance to the State Govt.'s for creating appropriate infrastructure for the development and growth of the export. States are expected to earmark at least 15 to 25% of their ASIDE Funds annual allocation on a AEZs. SLEC of respective states must give priority for prospects covering facilities like laboratories /CETP etc on PPP basis. At present a toll bridge on river kharkai has been taken up under the scheme and about 50% work has been completed.

### **3.24 Project and Feasibility Report and Consultancy Work**

The Industries Department performs a major role in promoting, facilitating and coordinating the accelerated growth of Industry in the state. For formulation of projects and for consultancy work related to industrial development, allocation of fund is necessary. Also for formulation of revival schemes of sick industries under JIRS-2003 and financial vetting of the proposals, provision has to be made. Consultancy work is also needed for ensuring proper scrutinisation of the Govt's financial exposure involved in such revival.

### **3.25 Publicity and Publication of the Departmental Schemes**

For making wide publicity of different departmental programmes, policies and activities with regard to the large, medium and small sector, entrepreneurs and to attract entrepreneurs of State and outside the State to set up industries in Jharkhand, it is to strengthen this scheme requires to be strengthened.

### **3.26 Jharkhand Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (JIIDCO)**

Jharkhand Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation has been established to create, develop and maintain infrastructure facilities for systematic growth of industrial units in the State of Jharkhand. They may also appoint consultants, contractors for the purpose of carrying on business of the company and render assistance to enterprise in obtaining managerial, technical and administrative services.
